Booth Museum Summer Dinner Theatre a Great Success

Third and final in series to be held Thursday, August 19

AUGUST 2010 – As part of this year's Summer Entertainment series, the Booth Western Art Museum has featured a Dinner Theatre in the beautiful Booth Ballroom. Held the third Thursday in June and July, the events have attracted more than 100 people per show. Each month, visitors have enjoyed a live performance complete with a delicious buffet dinner. An hour before the 7:00 pm Dinner Theatre, a cash bar has also been available. The third and final Dinner Theatre of the summer will be held on Thursday, August 19, and will feature Doc Stovall and Jim Dunham performing *Bullets & Ballads*. Tickets are just \$25 for Booth members and \$30 for non-members.

"It has been especially rewarding this summer to see the response and support we have received for our Dinner Theatre programs," said Dunham, director of special projects at the Booth Museum. "Both *Evening with Mark Twain* and *Trails Plowed Under* were well attended. The food was great, the audience even better, and I look forward to our third in the trilogy, *Bullets and Ballads*. The only thing better than getting to play cowboy, is to have people come watch."

Partnering together for a popular favorite, Dunham and Stovall will perform *Bullets & Ballads* on August 19. This variety show features the talents of cowboy singer Stovall teamed with gun handler and humorist Dunham. While Dunham performs some of the most famous gun tricks from Western movies, Stovall sings a mix of Western movie standards and his own original work.

Said Stovall, entertainment and sponsorship manager at the Booth Museum, "*Bullets & Ballads* offers a new and exciting way to look at the history of the gunfighter through music and fancy gun handling. And, for those that may have seen the show before, we have added new material about Doc Holliday, Wyatt Earp and some of the other popular gunfighters of Arizona."

In addition to an exciting live performance, guests enjoy a delicious dinner. This month's feature is pork chops, green beans, mashed potatoes, macaroni and cheese, vegetable medley, and rolls. For dessert, guests may select a lemon sherbet or summer berry trifle. Tea and water are included, and a cash bar will be available beginning at 6:00 pm.
